Leaders Training Policy

All adult leaders should strive to be trained in their respective positions.

At the very least, all adult leaders must have taken Youth Protection Training and Cub Scout Leader Fast Start. These courses are available on-line at <http://olc.scouting.org/>

Adult leaders are encouraged to attend the monthly Roundtable Meetings at Aldersgate United Methodist Church. Roundtable is where adult leaders from across the Colonial District come together to learn about scouting events in the Council and District, and discuss how to plan and run a program. Roundtable is on the second Tuesday of the month, starting at 8:00. Socializing starts at 7:30.

Adult leaders are also encouraged to attend the annual Pow-Wow, a Cub Scout leader training event held on a Saturday in November, and University of Scouting, an all-day training event held on a Saturday in the Spring. At both events, adult leaders get to choose from a wide variety of courses to help them learn to be better leaders.

The Pack must have at least one BALOO trained adult leader at all outdoor events. BALOO is a training program on how to run a safe and fun outdoor event for Cub Scouts.

The Pack must also have at least one Safe Swim Defense trained adult leader for all water events, even if the event takes place at a pool with a lifeguard. Safe Swim Defense can be taken on-line at <http://olc.scouting.org/>
